#### **Get Your Certificate in University Teaching**

A prime advantage of FPP membership is that you are eligible to pursue the Certificate in University Teaching (CUT), which looks great on your job-market CV.

#### **Ratchet Up Your Programming with an FPP Grant**

Do you have an idea for a departmental FPP event that would be of



general interest and benefit to FPP participants across campus? If an award of **up to \$500** would help make your dream a reality, you can apply for just that in the form of an <u>FPP Grant</u> from the Graduate School. Funded programs must be open to the FPP community and broadly relevant.

Possible uses include speaker honoraria and travel, food, room fees, publicity, and costs associated with publication or web upload. Creative ideas about non-event

services or projects of value to aspiring academics will also be considered.

FPP participants, faculty, or administrators can make proposals using the easy online <a href="Departmental Funding Request Form">Departmental Funding Request Form</a>, or email Glenn Wright (<a href="glwright@syr.edu">glwright@syr.edu</a>) with a description of the event and its relevance to a general audience of FPP members, a tentative date and location, and a budget or explanation of how the money will be used. Now accepting proposals for the 2016-17 academic year — when the money's gone, it's gone, so make your pitch soon!

#### **Know Your Stipend Process**

You've heard the rumors ... Not only do you have great professional development opportunities handed to you as an FPP participant, you get paid for it? Yes, it's true. FPP enrollees are eligible for a total of two years of stipend funding, at an

amount that varies by college but is guaranteed to meet or exceed the Graduate School's contribution of \$150/individual.



In mid-March (exact deadline forthcoming) you'll need to submit an FPP Participation Summary form to your FPP faculty liaison, documenting your activity in the program. Then early May, just as your assistantship money is about to run out, you get a nice little dollop of cash. Sweet deal!
