- Use of AI for drafting?

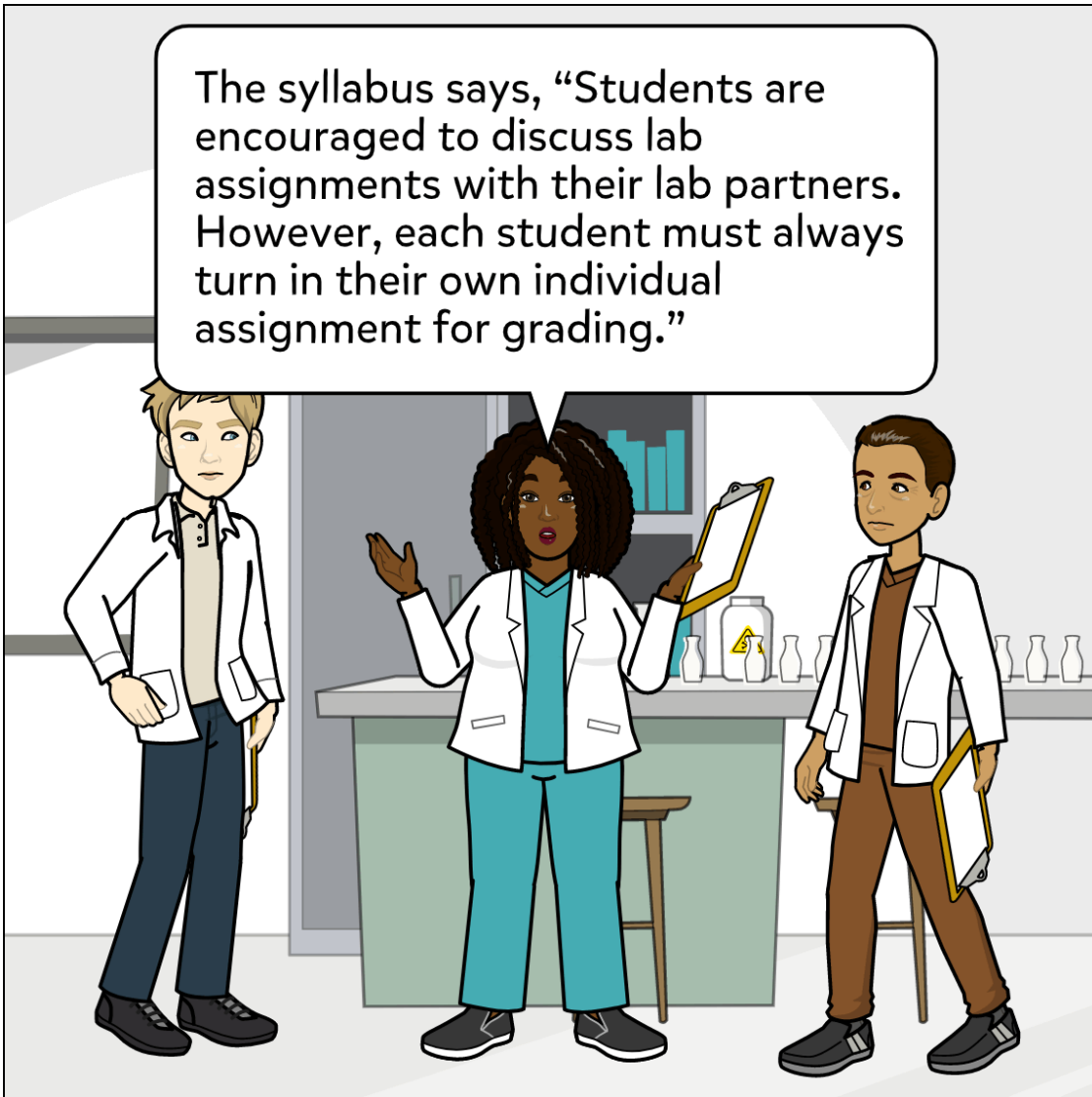

So comparing notes is fine! We just have to write our own papers!

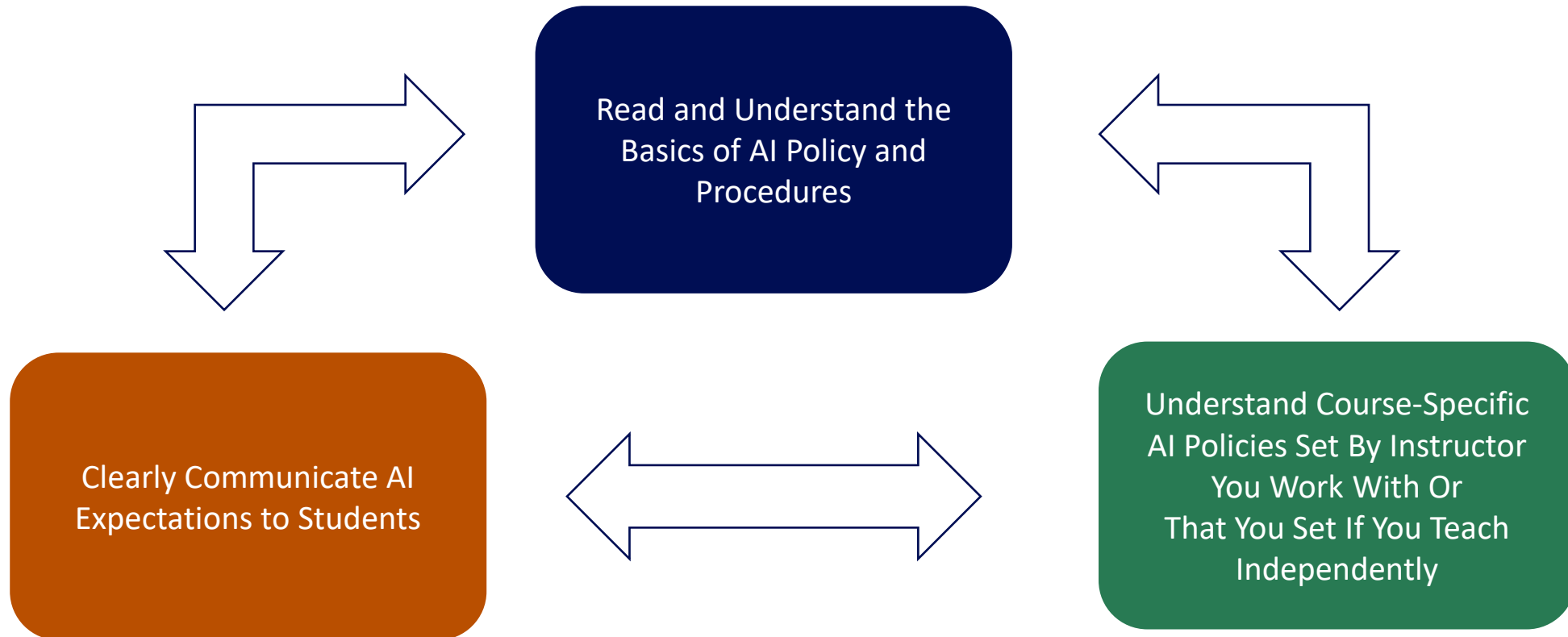
