Where to begin?

- Gather (and keep) everything related to teaching!
- Organize materials into categories
- Reflect on materials and experiences in the moment

Create an Introduction to your Portfolio

- What is your objective?
- Answer this: What is the reader going to be reading about and why should they read it?
- Create a Personal Statement or Letter of Qualification
 - Why are you qualified for the position?
 - What are your career goals?

- Write or update a curriculum vitae
 - An expanded résumé
 - Academic and professional information
 - Teaching and research interests
- Create or update a teaching summary
 - Course description
 - Your responsibilities

Write your Teaching Philosophy

- What is teaching to you?
- Complete these statements:
- It is the teacher's job to...
- It is important that a teacher...

Also:

- List your teaching strategies
- Think of cases in which you've used your philosophy
- Read others' statements

Teaching Experience

- Create or update a teaching summary
 - Course description
 - Your responsibilities
- How much to include?
 - How much or how little experience do you have?
- Demonstrate your experience through Teaching Materials

Evaluations

- Student
 - Raw Data
 - Statistical Breakdown
 - Qualitative vs Quantitative
 - Formal vs. Informal
- Peer
- Faculty

- Context
- Explanation
- What is most important to you?
- Develop a story about you and your teaching through the portfolio
- Anyone who reads it should know what it is like to be a student in your class...

- Professional activities and development
 - Research papers and presentations
 - Conferences
 - Community service
 - Participation in pedagogical activities
 - Anything that influences you and your teaching!

Format & Organization...

- Section descriptions
- Make it easy to read by using tabs, a table of contents, etc.
- What fits your narrative structure, experience, etc.
- Pdf/binder vs. website
